#### **Section 1: Murphy Family Tree**

- Names and identification number of each descendant of William Murphy [12] and Ann Mimion [13] up to the 4<sup>th</sup> generation. Each new generation is indented. It should be noted that the tree is not complete. It contains only those members for which there is a photo or other documentation.

#### **Note on Organization of the Family Tree:**

1. Each person has been designated a number which correlates to their position on the family tree. The first two identified members of the family are each given a number. Each consecutive child is then given a letter to the end of that number. For example, the first child is 1-2a, the second child is 1-2b, and so on. The numbering system continues with each new generation being given an additional letter signifying their position within the tree.
2. Each spouse of a direct descendant is designated with Sp. for Spouse. For example, if they are married to the third child in the family tree, they would be numbered as, "1-2c.Sp." If they have more than more spouse, it will be denoted by a number after the Sp. "1-2c.Sp.2."

If an individual in this family tree is connected to another family associated with the project, that person's identification number will change in their second tree.

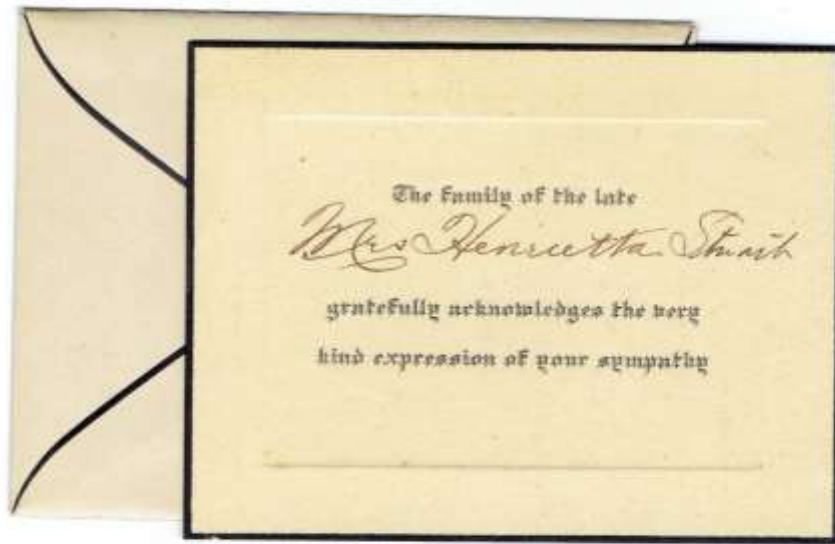

- © We also believe that ~~Ann~~ ANN GILTRAP (ARTHUR'S WIFE) had a brother William who came to Canada to settle in Logan. I have noted him in the assessment records.
- D. The following stories are part of the family's oral traditions. We have absolutely no proof of their validity.

Ann Giltrap was descended out of a prominent Anglo-Irish family in County Carlow, Ireland. Her grandmother Ann was either married or, at least connected to Lord John Russell. Ann Russell had 3 daughters: Mary <sup>who</sup> ~~was~~ married Lord Malbone (Malone), Isabella who married Giltrap and Jane who married Lord Duggit. Isabella had two children, Ann and William.

Ann fell in love with her father's gardener (in another version, it's the butler). Her parents threatened to disown her but her aunt, Lady Malbone, who is childless, offered to support Ann if she married Murphy. The marriage took place and the family subsequently moved to Canada.

Some years later Lady Malbone died leaving her estate to the children of her dead niece Ann Murphy. The lawyer's letter came to Mary (Ann's 7<sup>th</sup> daughter) who, by now, was dead and whose family lived in the U.S.

The family being unaware of the family history did nothing. Some years later the Canadian branch of the family heard of the will, and while they attempted to re-open the case, they were unsuccessful.

Finally, a story is told of Ann Murphy sending Lorne to Ireland for her riding habit so that she could use the material to make clothes for her children.

Mrs. Love is the former Marion Robb, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Robb. Mr. Love is a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. William Love.

Three guests who attended the wedding 50 years ago were present for the open house on Saturday. They were Mrs. Love's sister Mrs. Frank (Jane) Ward of Listowel; a long-time family friend, Mrs. Archie McTavish of London and Mrs. Love's brother Alex Robb of Atwood.

Following their marriage, Mr. and Mrs. Love went to Wood-

row, Sask., where they took up farming. In 1930 they returned to Elma Township, farming on lot 7 con. 7 until 1932 when they purchased the farm on lot 23 con. 12 from Mr. Love's father.
