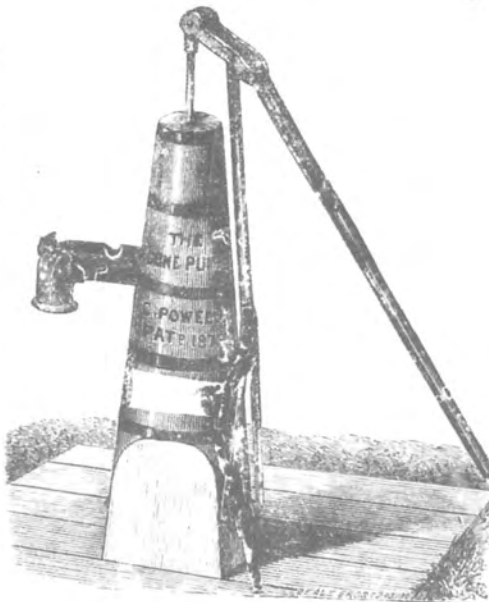

THE thriving town of Stratford, the county seat of Perth, is pleasantly located on the river Avon, at the angles of the townships of Ellice, North and South Easthope and Downie, and is the centre of one of the most fertile and thickly settled agricultural districts of the Province. At the present time it is perhaps the most rapidly growing town in the Province, with a population of between 8,000 and 9,000. It is also the seat of a considerable manufacturing interest, and with its natural facilities for growth and expansion, coupled with the active, enterprising spirit characteristic of its business population, is destined in the near future to become a city of no mean proportions. It is distant from London 39 miles, from Goderich 45 miles, from Hamilton 61 miles, from Sarnia 80 miles, from Buffalo 115 miles, from Windsor and Detroit 143 miles, and from Toronto 88 miles.

The business streets are lined with many fine blocks and stores, devoted to the varied departments of trade and commerce, while numerous elegant mansions and residences adorn the suburban portions.

The town was lighted with gas for the first time in January of the present year (1876), a company composed of leading citizens of the town having been incorporated for this purpose in 1874. At the date of this writing, about two miles of mains have been laid. The gas is manufactured from wood and petroleum, which is said to give a much superior light to that produced from coal, while at the same time it is much

less expensive. The Gas Works are located on Wellington street, near the G. T. R., and "instead of being, as was at first supposed, an eye-sore to the neighbourhood, presents a handsome appearance, and will be no discredit either to the town or street. The building in which the gas is manufactured is a handsome structure, 100 X 30 feet, of red brick, relieved by arches of white. It is roofed with slate, the framework of the centre portion being of iron, and perfectly fire-proof. The front of the building will be used for an office, the centre for the retorts and boiler, and the rear for storing coal and other supplies. Adjoining the building is the gasometer, which is capable of holding about 20,000 cubic feet—enough for the wants of Stratford for some time to come."* The citizens of the town are to be congratulated on the success of this much needed improvement, and the Company are worthy of the thanks of the community for the energetic manner in which they have prosecuted the enterprise.

A good system of water works is the next most needed public improvement, and will no doubt not long be delayed.

Several first-class hotels, fitted up with every convenience, with other good houses of more humble pretensions, afford every facility of a home for the traveling public.

Stratford contains a number of fine public buildings, prominent among which may be mentioned the Court House and Jail, on the height on the north bank of the river, a brick structure, erected in 1852; the Market House in the centre of the Market Square, containing the Town Hall and the various offices connected with the Town Government, which is also a handsome brick structure; the Odd Fellows'

Building, on Downie Street, opposite the Market House; the Waverly, Phoenix and Albion Blocks, on Ontario street; the Mowat Block, corner of Market and Wellington; the Thompson & Williams Manufacturing Company's Works, on Erie street, one of the most extensive works of the kind in the Dominion, together with other buildings of lesser note, testifying to the enterprising public spirit manifested by the citizens of this thriving town.

The citizens of Stratford are to be congratulated on the acquisition of the extensive manufacturing establishment of Messrs. Thompson & Williams, which gives employment to about 200 men. These works had been established in Mitchell about 15 years, but as it was deemed necessary to secure a more central point for their continually increasing business, they were removed to Stratford in 1875, the business men of the town, with commendable enterprise, subscribing \$40,000, and the town, \$10,000 to secure the location of the works at this place. A more detailed account of this extensive establishment will be found under the head of *Principal Manufactories.*

"In sight of the Thomson & Williams foundry, and almost under its shadow, is the new agricultural implement factory of Mr. Alex. McPherson, formerly of Clinton. The building is a frame one, two stories high, 110 X 40 feet, besides an addition 60 X 20 for engine room and blacksmith shop. The ground floor is to be devoted to the heavy machinery, while upstairs will be the wood-working and painting rooms. It is Mr. McPherson's intention at first to confine himself to the manufacture of threshing machines, and afterwards, should the business fulfil his expectations, to make other agricultural implements. It is expected to have the establishment in full running order in the spring of the

present year. The shop is situated on Railway Avenue, a short distance from the track, and is well located for shipping freight.*

Despite the cry of hard times, the season of 1875 has been a very busy one for Stratford builders. Every mechanic in town has had abundance of work, and the factories have worked extra time. Buildings have sprung up in every direction, the new surveys are being rapidly settled, and the probability is, that the present year (1876) will see a still greater increase, and that Stratford will take a long stride in its progress city-ward.

The railway station here is one of the finest in the Province, and the workshops in connection with the road are very extensive, and give employment to a large number of men.

Avondale Cemetery, "the City of the Dead," occupies a pleasant location in the north-west part, overlooking the "classic" Avon. It is tastefully laid out, with gravelled walks ornamented with shrubbery, and contains a number of handsome monuments. Here repose the mortal remains of the late lamented Robert MacFarlane, M.P., who represented this county in the councils of the nation from 1863 till 1867, when the county was divided, after which he represented the South Riding till his death, at Ottawa, June 1st, 1872. A handsome monument, of red granite, is being erected by a number of his friends and admirers, as a tribute to his worth. It is being executed at the Marble Works of Messrs. Gadsby & Sharman, and will be 14 feet high, and bear the following inscription:—

* *Stratford Beacon.*

"Erected by a few friends, in affectionate remembrance of Robert MacFarlane, M.P. for South Perth, who died while discharging his Parliamentary duties at Ottawa, June 1st, 1872, aged 37 years."

Connected with the Cemetery, but on the opposite side of the river, is a grove and pleasure grounds for the accommodation of pic-nic and pleasure parties.

The town supports four ably managed weekly papers, viz: *Stratford Herald*, *Stratford Beacon*, *Stratford Times*, and the *Canadian Colonist*, the latter being printed in the German language and liberally patronized by the German residents of the surrounding country.

The main line of the Grand Trunk Railway passes through the town from east to west, and is intersected by the Buffalo and Goderich Branch of the same road. The extension of the Port Dover and Lake Huron Railway from Woodstock to Stratford is being rapidly accomplished, and the spring of the present year, 1876, will witness its completion to this point. This line will open up a new avenue of travel to all points east and west, and traversing, as it will, some of the most fertile and productive townships of Canada, with many large and flourishing towns and villages, must add materially to the commercial interests of Stratford. Thus, it will be seen, that in her railway facilities, Stratford is rendered easy of access from all points.

In her school facilities, Stratford has every reason to congratulate herself on the excellent advantages provided, through the wisdom and liberality of her citizens, for the thorough education of her youth. The school buildings comprise a Central School, Grammar School, and four Ward Schools, thoroughly officered with an efficient corps of teachers, and liberally patronized. There is besides a Roman Catholic Separate School, which is also well sustained.

There are ten churches in the town, representing the usual phases of religious belief, viz: Presbyterian, Methodist, Baptist, Lutheran, Church of England, Independent, Roman Catholic, and a society of Plymouth Brethren, many of whose church buildings are unexcelled in attractiveness and point of architecture by those of any town in the Province, and are both a credit to the town and the societies originating them.

The section of country in which Stratford is now situated, was first purchased from the Government in 1827, by the Canada Company. This purchase consisted of a triangular block, commencing with the east limits of the townships of North and South Easthope, and extending towards Lake Huron, where the westerly limits extended from, and inclusive of the township of Bosanquet, to and including the township of Colborne. This block was then called the "Huron Tract," a name chiefly known now to the first settlers. The lands were then in the possession of the Indians, and for many years after were still frequented by them as their hunting grounds. It was not until 1833 that the first white settler of what is now the County of Perth (the late J. J. E. Linton, Esq.) took up his abode in the township of Downie. To the south, the nearest neighbour he had was near the Governor's road, which leads to London, and to the north, a few on what was called the "Huron Road," which leads to Goderich. North of that road, to the Georgian Bay, there were no settlers. The Company's lands, in 1832 and 1833, were sold at one dollar and a half per acre.

The Company laid out and reserved a town plot for a village, consisting of about 2,500 acres, at Stratford, and up to 1840 the place was known as the "Little Thames," the river Avon being a branch of the river Thames, and flowing into the latter above St. Marys. The name of the river was after-

wards changed to Avon and that of the village to Stratford, in honour of the birth place of the immortal bard. The wards of the town are named Avon, Falstaff, Hamlet, Romeo and Shakspeare.

The first sawmill was erected in 1833 by D. Ford and John Sebring, at "Little Thames." A grist and flouring mill was erected by the same parties in the following year. The latter was the first erected on the Company's lands, and was the only one north and west of the line of London at that time. Messrs. Linton, Sebastian Fryfogle, Andrew Sebach, Henry Rumstaller and William Sergeant were the earliest settlers in the village and its vicinity. The latter was the proprietor of the "Shakspeare Inn," and held lands in the township adjoining. The first store was opened in one of the log shanties erected west of the bridge, early in 1834, by George Worsley, and afterwards continued in a small frame building opposite, by John C. W. Daly, Esq., for several years. Mr. Daly was the first postmaster and held the appointment for many years. He was succeeded in the office by Alex. F. Mickle, who held it till the 10th March, 1858, when the post office was burned and he lost his life in the fire. Mr. Daly acted as agent for the Canada Company for 30 years, and was for many years senior magistrate and militia officer for the counties of Huron, Perth and Bruce, and is still a resident of the town. John Monteith also commenced a store at an early date. The next store was opened in 1839 by John Gowinlock.

In 1832 the present counties of Huron, Perth and Bruce, were called the "London District," and London was the district town. In 1838 the district and county of Huron were formed, Goderich being the county town. The population of the district was then 4,000. In 1847 efforts were made by the inhabitants of Stratford and neighborhood to have certain

townships separated from the county of Huron and formed into a separate district and county, to be called Bannockburn or Peel. The population of this portion was then nearly 10,000. The late J. J. E. Linton, Esq., was delegated to Montreal, where Parliament then was, to obtain the separation, and in January, 1849, after encountering many obstacles, he succeeded in obtaining the separation, and had the honor of naming the county, with Stratford as the county town. The name of "Perth" was given out of respect to the first settlers in North Easthope, who were from Glengwaich, Perthshire, Scotland. In January, 1852, the county was set apart by proclamation of the Governor. The village was incorporated in January, 1854, the population at that date having reached 1,400. It was incorporated as a town in 1858, when the population had increased to about 2,500. In 1856 it was stated as to Stratford, that "as a place of internal importance it is destined to become second to no other town in the western peninsula of Canada." At this present date the population may be safely estimated at over 8,000.

Churches.

ST. ANDREW'S PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH is located on St. Andrew street, it is built of white brick, was erected in 1866 at a cost of about \$8,000, and has a seating capacity of 450. The society was first organized in connection with Woodstock charge in 1838; re-organized in connection with North Easthope in 1848; and created a separate charge in 1857. The number of communicants is 192. Public services are held each Sabbath at 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. Sabbath School at 3 p.m. Prayer Meeting every Tuesday evening. Rev. Wm. T. Wilkins, A.M., pastor; Alex.

Caven, session clerk; Samuel Robb, John F. Scholz, Alex. Morrison, Wm. Byers, Wm. Taylor, Robert Henry, elders; Board of Management—Wm. Mowat, chairman; Andrew Robb, secretary; Wm. Byers, treasurer; John F. Scholz, Robert Rutherford, J. G. Kirk.

KNOX CHURCH (Presbyterian) is located on Ontario street, corner of Waterloo. It is built of white brick, with a spire over 200 feet in height. It was erected in 1872, at a cost of \$20,000, and has a seating capacity of 1,000. There are about 270 members. The congregation was first organized in the fall of 1849, by the present pastor, Rev. Thos. Macpherson, who has continued the pastoral charge to the present time. Services are held at 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m., each Sabbath. The Sabbath School, which has about 400 members, is held at 3 p.m. Prayer meeting every Thursday evening. Bible class, Friday evening. John Owen, superintendent of Sabbath School. Wm. Dunn, Ralph Donaldson and David Barton, elders; James Wilson, precentor; Robert McAuley, beadle.

THE BAPTIST CHURCH is located on Ontario street, near Waterloo. It is a frame building. The number of members is about 100. Services at 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m., each Sabbath. Sabbath School and Bible Class at 2.30 p.m. Teachers' meeting every Tuesday evening. Prayer meeting Thursday evening. Rev. Charles Walker, pastor. Wm. Sharman, superintendent of Sabbath School. Thos. Birch and David Davis, deacons. Cl. T. Campbell, M.D., clerk.

ST. JAMES' CHURCH OF ENGLAND is located on St. George street, near Huron; it is built of brick, of early English Gothic architecture, was erected about 1869, at a cost of about

\$20,000, and has a seating capacity of about 900. The society numbers about 300 families. Services are held at 11 a.m. and 7 p.m. each Sabbath; Sabbath School at 3 p.m. A Mission Sabbath School is also maintained at the G. T. R. station at 2.30 p.m. with an attendance of about 80 pupils. Rev. E. Patterson, M.A., rector. Rev. L. Des Brissay, B. A., curate. J. Brotherhood, organist. J. P. Woods and J. Corrie, wardens. S. S. Fuller and J. Powell, delegates to Diocesan Synod.

ZION LUTHERAN CHURCH is located on Cambria street, near intersection of Gore. It is built of white brick, was erected in 1873, and cost \$2,500. The society was organized in 1863 and numbers about 20 members. There is no resident pastor, but preaching is held on Sunday afternoons by Rev. C. Spring, of Hamburg. Sabbath School at 1 p.m. in winter, and 9 a.m. in summer, of which Edward Paekert is superintendent. Albert Witte, president; Michael Scherer, secretary; Henry Kalbfleisch, cashier.

THE CENTRAL METHODIST CHURCH is located on Erie street, near Patrick. It is built of white brick and was erected in 1874, at a cost of about \$20,000. It has a seating capacity of 1,000. There are 237 members. Public services are held each Sabbath at 11 a.m. and 7 p.m. Sabbath School at 2.30 p.m. Prayer meeting every Thursday evening. Young People's meeting (Bible class and prayer meeting) every Tuesday evening. Two mission churches in connection with this society are in contemplation, and Sabbath Schools are being organized. Rev. Manly Benson, pastor. James Huston, superintendent of Sabbath School.

THE PRIMITIVE METHODIST CHURCH is located on Waterloo street, near Dourc. It is a frame building, erected about

1861, with a seating capacity of about 300. The society was organized the same year. The number of members is about 60. Public services are held each Sabbath at 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. Sabbath School at 2.30 p.m. Prayer meeting Thursday evening. Bible class Monday evening. Class meeting Tuesday evening. Rev. J. P. Bell, pastor. Richard Corrie, superintendent of the Sabbath School.

CHRIST CHURCH (Independent) is located on Waterloo street, corner of Brunswick. It is built of white brick, was opened in 1874, and cost \$10,000. The seating capacity is about 400, and that of the vestry 100. The society was organized December 30, 1846, with 9 members, the present membership is 70. Services are held at 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. each Sabbath. Sabbath School at 2.30 p.m. Lecture every Wednesday at 7 p.m. Choir meeting at 8 o'clock the same evening. Rev. W. H. Heu de Bourck, pastor. John Dutton and Wm. Walden, superintendents of Sabbath School.

ST. JOSEPH'S CHURCH (Roman Catholic) is situated on Huron street, near St. George. It is built of white brick, with cut stone dressings, and was erected in 1868 at a cost of \$30,000. Its dimensions are 160 feet long by 70 wide, the transepts being 82 feet, and height 52. The style of architecture is the second period of gothic. The spire, when completed, will be 180 feet high. The inside consists of nave and side aisles, chancel, porches and vestry. The roof is supported by fourteen pillars. The ceiling is groined with moulded ribs and bosses. On each side of rear of transepts stands an octagonal pillar, 50 feet high, which adds much to the beauty and stability of the structure. The walls are adorned with excellent oil paintings, illustrative of Scriptural scenes and characters. The altar, considered to be the finest

in the Province, is a beautiful piece of architecture, and adorned with 11 Munich statues imported from Italy. There are three entrance doors to the auditorium, which is seated for 1,000 persons on the ground floor, and 250 in the gallery. Services are held at 8.30 and 11 a.m. each Sabbath. Sunday School at 3 p.m. Vespers at 7 p.m. Rev. E. B. Kilroy, pastor. Rev. A. Wasereau, assistant pastor.

The society usually known as Plymouth Brethren, has been organized about 10 years. There are from 25 to 30 members. Public services are held each Sabbath as follows: viz, Communion at 11 a.m. Sunday School at 2.30 p.m. Preaching at 6.30 p.m. Wm. Glendinning, superintendent of Sabbath School.

Principal Manufactories.

The Thompson & Williams Manufacturing Co., on the corner of Erie and Galt streets, was incorporated in 1874, with a capital of \$100,000. About 200 men are employed in the manufacture of all kinds of agricultural implements, Johnston's harvesters, broadcast seeders, seed drills, sawing machines and horse powers, ploughs, gang ploughs, &c. The works consist of two departments: the agricultural, and the engine and mill. They are largely engaged in the erection of grist and flouring mills, saw mills, stave factories, cheese factories, &c., &c., the machinery for which they manufacture. They build all sizes of steam engines and boilers, upright and horizontal, portable and stationary. They are also engaged in the manufacture of a superior system of water works, of which

they make a speciality. The sales amount to about \$200,000 per annum.

The Fanning Mill and Separator Manufactory of Barthel & Co., on Erie street, near St. David, was established in 1875. Capital about \$7,000. About six men are employed, with facilities for turning out about 500 mills per annum.

A building for the manufacture of threshing machines and other agricultural implements is in process of erection on R. R. avenue, and it is expected to be in operation in the spring of the present year (1876). Alex. McPherson, proprietor.

The Fanning Mill Manufactory of M. Glenn & Co., on Erie street, near Galt, has recently been established for the manufacture of Glenn's Patent Separator, patented November 16th, 1875.

The Saw Mill of Isaac Rigg, on Erie street, near Galt, employs from 10 to 12 men.

The Stave and Heading Manufactory of Barthel & Durst, on the corner of Wellington and St. David streets, was established in 1873. Capital from \$7,000 to \$8,000. From 10 to 12 men are employed in the manufacture of staves, headings, flour barrels, &c., to the value of about \$6,000 per annum.

The Dominion Tannery, on Erie street, south of Galt, was established in 1875. Six men are employed. Thos. Collins, proprietor.

The Stratford Tannery, on the corner of Church and Patrick streets, was established in 1865. Capital about \$10,000. Four men are employed. Sales about \$15,000 per annum. Alex. Smith, proprietor.

Little Lake Brick Yard, at Little Lake, on the Shakespeare road, about two miles east of Stratford, has been established

about 17 years. Capital about \$6,000. Seventeen men are employed in the manufacture of white brick, about 1,000,000 of which are manufactured annually. Wm. Roberts, proprietor.

The Soda Water Manufactory of John Pratt, on Erie street, corner of Patrick, was established in 1869. Capital about \$3,000. Six men are employed, and the sales amount to from \$4,000 to \$5,000 per annum.

The Sash and Blind Factory of David Nicol, on William street, was established in 1871. Capital about \$10,000. Eighteen men are employed in the manufacture of sashes, doors and blinds, and in a general building business to the amount of about \$15,000 annually.

Perth Furniture Warerooms, at 1, 3, and 5 Ontario street, were established in 1874. Capital about \$14,000. About 14 men are employed, and the sales amount to about \$22,000 per annum. Campbell & Abraham, proprietors.

The Cigar Manufactory of James G. Brown, at 139 Huron street, was established in 1873. Seven men are employed in the manufacture of 25,000 cigars monthly.

The Stratford Marble Works of Gadsby & Sharman, on Downie street, near George, were established in 1871. Four men are employed.

The Potash Manufactory of Francis McCracken, on Wellington street, corner of Gore, was established in 1875. Five men are employed in the manufacture of five barrels of potash per week.

The Tannery and Whip Manufactory of John F. Scholz, at 89 Erie street, was established in 1860. Eight hands are employed, and the sales amount to about \$20,000 per annum.

The Stratford Woollen Mills, at 3 Church street, were established in 1868. Capital about \$30,000. About twenty hands are employed. J. Sugden & Sons, proprietors.

The Stratford Flouring Mills, on York street, have five runs of stones, with a capacity of 100 barrels a day. James Foster, proprietor.

The Sharman & Foster Manufacturing Co., on Birmingham street, opposite Patrick, has been established about 20 years. Capital about \$25,000. Twenty men are employed in the manufacture of the Little Giant Thresher, combined mowers and reapers, and other farming implements, to the value of about \$40,000 per annum.

The Perth Carriage Works, at 18 Huron street, were established in 1869. From six to eight men are employed in the manufacture of carriages, sleighs, &c., to the value of about \$7,000 per annum. James Walkom, proprietor.

The Avon Planing Mills, on Mill street, were established in 1857. About 25 men are employed in the manufacture of sashes, doors, blinds, mouldings, and in a general building business, to the amount of from \$20,000 to \$25,000 per annum. Seringeour Bros., proprietors.

The Cigar Manufactory of C. F. Guessel, on Ontario street, was established in July, 1875. About five men are employed in the manufacture of \$600 worth of cigars monthly.

The Pottery of J. B. Helbling, on Hibernia street, near Vincent, was established in 1871. From four to six hands are employed in the manufacture of about \$2,000 worth of goods annually.

Eason's Saw Mill, on William street, near Mary, was established about 1854. From 40 to 50 men are employed in the manufacture of sashes, doors, blinds, furniture, and in a

general building business, to the value of about \$20,000 per annum.

The Flax Mill of S. S. Fuller was established on Nile street in 1869. It was destroyed by fire in 1871, and rebuilt immediately on its present site, by the river, at the rear of Water street. Capital about \$15,000. About 50 hands are employed in the manufacture of from 1,000 to 1,100 tons of raw flax per annum. The sales amount to about \$25,000 per annum.

The Pump Manufactory of Osborn & Werrell, on Douro street, near Waterloo, has been established about 20 years. About 200 log pumps are turned out annually, valued at about \$1,500.

The Furniture Manufactory of B. McEvoy, on Cobourg street, was established in 1870. Five men are employed in the manufacture of about \$15,000 worth of furniture annually.

The Avon Tannery, on Cobourg street, was established in 1849. Capital from \$15,000 to \$20,000. Five men are employed in the manufacture of about 2,000 hides per annum, valued at about \$10,000. Geo. Hilton, proprietor.

The Stratford Planing Mills, on Cobourg street, were established in 1872. Capital from \$18,000 to \$20,000. From 25 to 30 men are employed in the manufacture of sash, doors, blinds, &c., to the value of about \$40,000 per annum. Thos. Orr, proprietor.

The Counter Check Book Manufactory of Gordon & McKay on York street, was established in 1873. Capital about \$5,000. From six to eight hands are employed in the manufacture of about 40,000 counter check books annually.

The Soap and Candle Works of Benj. Rigg, on Erie street, near Cambria, were established about 1866. Capital employed about \$5,000. The sales amount to about \$12,000 per annum.

The Stratford Spring Brewery, on Patrick street, near Birmingham, was established in 1874. It has facilities for manufacturing 100 barrels a week.

The Dominion Pump Works, at 9^o Downie street, were established in 1871. About \$2,500 worth of wooden pumps are sold annually. Wm. H. Seldon, proprietor.
