Every summer, as folks drive towards or away from Shakespeare, a tiny village in Perth East, they pass the TNT Berries blueberry patch, right off Highway 7/8. Nestled between cultivated fields, these blueberries are tucked away down a long-laneway, quietly producing one of the most beloved of summer-time fruits.

For about 6 weeks, this patch is abuzz with activity; pick-your-own blueberries begin their season mid-July, blueberries are also picked for orders (guaranteeing amounts requested) and freshly picked raspberries that often precede blueberries can be enjoyed during their own season in the beginning of July.

The patch is open daily during the season, typically from 8am until 4pm, though it does close for both poor weather and when the berries need a day to ripen. You can follow along on socials, @tntberries for daily updates and the staff additionally encourages patrons to call ahead (519)-625-1468 to confirm hours or picking conditions. Orders for freshly picked blueberries and raspberries can be placed in their respective seasons via a call, message on socials or the order form found on www.tntberries.com.

While not certified organic, the patch is not sprayed, and instead is tended carefully by hand by teams throughout the seasons. Led by Nadia and Mags Walch, the Walch family lives around the corner of the blueberry patch, at 4163 Perth Road 107 where the third type of berry, sea buckthorns, can be picked and purchased in their respective season.

From patch to table, this Perth County gem has delivered seasonal goodness for almost three decades.
